In Chile, the transport sector contributes to 25% of CO2 emissions, and 40% of Santiago's air pollution.

Chile took a historic step towards sustainable mobility and the reduction of greenhouse gases in February 2024, with a 13-year commitment financing more than 300 million dollars aiming to address this problem.

This milestone commitment followed a long period of negotiations and re-affirmed BancoEstado's role as a strategic partner to the government.

This initiative demonstrates the BancoEstado's commitment to electromobility, supports the global transition towards a lower-emissions economy, and brings Chile closer to its climate change goals.

BancoEstado, together with the World Bank Group's IFC and the IDB, contributed nearly \$80 million to this project.

The new buses will replace diesel-powered buses, which will be fuelled with energy obtained from renewable sources, and will reduce emissions by 47,092 tons of CO2 per year. This is equivalent to removing about 10,000 petrol cars from the roads for a year.



BancoEstado is prioritising supporting the development of sustainable projects that not only improve people's quality of life but also contribute to Chile's transition to net zero.
